### THE KILGORIS PROJECT

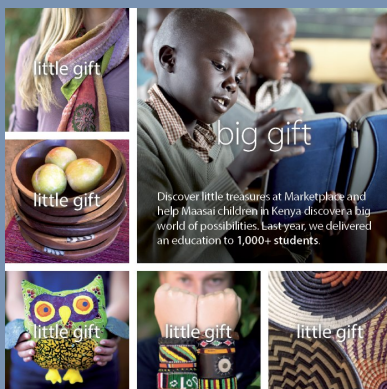
#### Global Service Project
