

GESELL SCREENING

The Gesell Screening is a comprehensive multi-dimensional assessment system that assists educators, and other professionals in understanding characteristics of child behavior in relation to typical growth patterns between 2½ to 9 years of age. This screening uses direct observation to evaluate a child's cognitive, language, motor and social-emotional responses in five strands: Developmental, Letter/Numbers, Language/Comprehension, Visual/Spatial, and Social/Emotional/Adaptive. Gesell Screenings are assessed at LACS by Mrs. Cathy Robinson, Assistant Head of Schools for Learning Services.
