Students in the full-day Senior kindergarten program learn and develop socially, academically, emotionally, and spiritually in a thematic, age-appropriate environment. In language arts, students are taught the foundation of phonics through the Slingerland method as they begin learning to read, write, and spell. Students are taught the mechanics of sentence structure and apply those skills to journaling using educational themes. For math concepts, students learn all state standards including sorting, patterning, counting, addition and subtraction, shapes, and measurements. Social studies include learning to read maps and graphs, the importance of community service helpers as well as topics in national and state government. Science includes the life cycle of a plant, states of matter and energy, animal habitats, seasons, and weather. In Bible, students learn about creation, the life of Christ, prayer, and missions.



WHAT IS GESELL SCREENING

The Gesell Screening is a comprehensive multi-dimensional assessment system that assists educators, and other professionals in understanding characteristics of child behavior in relation to typical growth patterns between 2½ to 9 years of age. The Gesell Screening uses direct observation to evaluate a child's cognitive, language, motor and social-emotional responses in five strands:

- Developmental
- Letter/Numbers
- Language/Comprehension
- · Visual/Spatial,
- Social/Emotional/Adaptive



A child's performance on each strand corresponds to a Performance Level Rating (Age Appropriate, Emerging or Concern) and a Developmental Age. Developmental Age, determined by the calculating the results of the GDO-R, is an age in years and half-years that best describes a child's behavior and performance on a developmental scale; may be equal to, older or younger, than the child's actual chronological age. It encompasses a child's social, emotional, intellectual and physical make up.
