## 2022-2023 School Profile

### HISTORY

In 1981, the leadership of First Baptist Church of Los Altos envisioned an additional area of ministry for the church. A dedicated core group of the membership studied other Christian schools in the area and prayerfully made the decision to open a Christian school on the church's campus. The founding documents were written, and the first school administrator was hired. The doors of Los Altos Christian Schools opened in September, 1981 with a student body of 68 children in grades K – 6.

Early on, LACS administration and staff saw the need to provide a specialized program for children of average to above average intelligence with diagnosed learning differences who were experiencing difficulties learning through traditional methods and strategies. A Learning Assistance Program was established with classrooms staffed with teachers knowledgeable about learning differences.

Following many parent requests for additional grades, a middle and a high school were eventually added. LACS will see its first high school graduating class in 2023. LACS High school is small, and offers specialized instruction to its students.

- Bible is required for each semester of attendance at LACS High School.
- Required Bible credits are waived for any semester that the student does not attend LACS.
- These credits may then be added to the required elective credits.
- Yearlong classes are 10 credits
- Semester-long classes are 5 credits
- Of the 150 credits required for UC eligibility, 70 credits must be taken in the last two years of high school.
- In order to qualify for UC eligibility, students must have a C or higher in all required courses.
- Pre-Algebra will not be awarded high school credit.
- Completion of math sequence through Algebra 2 is required to be college preparatory.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE GUIDELINES

Students must complete at least 50 hours of LACS-approved community service during their four-year high school career as part of their graduation requirements. Students will complete a minimum of 10 hours each year in the 9th and 10th grades, and 15 hours each year in the 11th and 12th grades.
